AN ACT

To enact a budget law for Fiscal Year 2024 through the authorization of the sum of \$122,434,700 and appropriation of the amount of \$112,446,458 from the National Treasury for the annual general operations, special revenue, and debt service budget of the Republic of Palau for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, and for related purposes.

THE PEOPLE OF PALAU REPRESENTED IN THE OLBIL ERA KELULAU DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known and may be cited as, "The Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Act."

Section 2. Executive Branch Operations. The sum of \$57,940,616 is authorized for appropriation and the amount of \$54,567,708 is hereby appropriated for expenditure and obligation for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purpose of covering the operational and contingent expenses of the Executive Branch. The total amount authorized to be appropriated shall come from the following sources: the amount of \$6,632,708 shall come from unrestricted local revenues; the amount of \$15,000,000 shall come from the Compact Trust Fund (CTF) established by Section 211(f) of the Compact of Free Association, and an additional \$30,000,000 shall come from the Compact Trust Fund established by Section 211(f) of the Compact of Free Association in the event the 2023 Compact Review Agreement (CRA) assistance package is not enacted by the Government of the United States by October 1, 2023; the amount \$2,600,000 shall come from the Blue Prosperity Grant fund; and the amount of \$335,000 shall come from the Pristine Paradise Environmental Fund allocation for the Palau International Airport. \$2,088,743 is hereby appropriated to purchase and install patient-critical medital and surgidal equipment for the Belau National Hospital, to perform upgrades, maintenance, and repairs at the Belau National Hospital necessary for the improvement of patient health and treatment, and for upgrading equipment that will have a significant impact on the ability of the Belau National Hospital to improve patient health outcomes. In particular, these funds should be used to ensure the Central Air Condition System, Oxygen System, RO Water System, Laundry Facility, Hospital Cafeteria, and Medical Store Rooms are returned to functionality as fully operative support components of the Hospital. The Belau National Hospital shall issue a detailed report on the use of these funds each quarter to the committees of the Senate and House of Delegates of the Olbitl Era Kelulau responsible for health.

The amount authorized to be appropriated and that is hereby appropriated shall come from the revenues derived from elinical and public health medical and dental services fees and charges during the fiscal year, so long as the actual expenditures or obligations do not exceed actual revenue receipts. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall noe lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 11. PAN Fund. The sum of \$626,000, or the actual amount collected, is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated for Fiscill Year 2024 for the purposes of the Protected Areas Network Fund pursuant to 40 PNC § 3413, as amended. The amount authorized to be appropriated in this section shall come from the Pristine Paradise Environmental Fee (PPEF) revenue allocation for environmental protection ("Green Fee") during the fiscal year. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 12. Road Maintenance Fund. The amount of \$610,000, or the actual amount collected, is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated for Fiscal Year 2024 for purposes of the Road Maintenance Fund to be used for the routine and periodic maintenance of the Compact Road and other national road infrastructure network. The amount authorized to be appropriated and that is hereby appropriated shall come from the revenues derived from Road Use tax and charges during the fiscal year, so long as the actual expenditures or obligations do not exceed actual revenue receipts. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 13. Belau National Hospital. The amount of \$2,610,000 is hereby authorized and appropriated from the Road Maintenance Fund and the Infrastructure Maintenance Fund in the 2010 Compact Review Agreement for the upgrade, repairs and renovation of the Belau National Hospital, to specifically include roof and grounds repairs as necessary to reduce leaking. As part of the repair process, the Minister of the Public Infrastructure and Industries shall hire a professional engineering firm to form a construction blan in conformity with a proposed utilization of the U.S. Infrastructure

Maintenance Fund. A complete and comprehensive report on the status and useful lifespan of the Belau National Hospital's physical structure shall be submitted together with the Construction Plan by the end of Fiscal Year 2024 to the Minister of Health and to the committees having responsibility for health within the Senate and House of Delegates of the Olbbl Era Kelalau; this report shall include construction plans and estimates as are necessary to satisfy all requirements for the use of the Compact of Free Association's Infrastructure Fund. The amount authorized to be appropriated and that is hereby appropriated by this Section shall come from the Road Maintenance Fund in the amount of \$610,000 and from the Infrastructure Maintenance Fund estaulished in the 2010 Compact Review Agreement in the amount of \$2,000,000. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 14. Deposit Beverage Container. The amount of \$535,000, or the actual amount callected, is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purposes of the Recycling Fund. The amount authorized to be appropriated and that is hereby appropriated shall come from fees derived from deposit of beverage containers pursuant to RPPL 9-24, so long as the actual expenditures or obligations do not exceed actual revenue receipts during the fiscal year. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 15. National Coordinating Mechanism for NCD. The amount of \$1,170,000 and the actual amount collected is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purposes of the National Coordinating Mechanism for NCD and Medicul Referrul Program. The amount authorized to be appropriated and that is hereby appropriated shall come from avallable funding from the 10% allocation of the annual revenues derived from taxes imposed on alcohalic beverages and tobacco during the fiscal year pursuant to RPPL No. 9-57, as amended. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year. Section 21. Outside Grants and Development Assistance.

(a) All external funds received from development partners and donors are hereby authorized to be appropriated and are appropriated for Fiscal Year 2024

in the amount received for those specific programs or projects for which they are granted, donated, or otherwise contributed. U.S. Federal Program Grants cost recoveries associated with such program grants may be retained for use by the President for such purpose as are needed to implement such programs or projects for which they were granted.

- (b) The Minister of Finance shall submit to the Olbiil Era Kelplau, a quarterly report, a detailed description of the source and use of all external funds. The detailed description shall include, at minimum:
 - (1) the purpose of the grant or other externol funds;

Section 23. Wage and Salary Increase for National Full Time Employees.

Section 25. Compact Review Advisory Group. The amount of \$500,000 is authorized for appropriation and the amount of \$400,000 is hereby appropriated for expenditure or obligation for Fiscal Year 2024 to provide funding support for the ongoing work and activities, including lobbylst and consultation work, of the Compact Review Advisory Group as established by Executive Order No. 447. The entire amount authorized and appropriated in this section shall come from local revenues and be non-lapsing. The entire amount authorized and appropriated in this section shall come from locul revenues. This section shall be exempt from competitive procurement requirements of Chapter 6 of Title 40 of the Palau National Code.

Section 27. <u>Civil Settlement</u>. The sum of \$350,000 is authorized for appropriation for Fiscal Year 2024 for the settlement of the wrongfal death selaim of Mr. Russel Takisang Iyar in accordance with the terms and conditions of the settlement agreement.

Section 28. <u>Pacific Games</u>. The sum of \$250,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated for expenditure or obligation for Fiscal Year 2024 as preparation fund for Palau's participation in the Pacific Games schedaled to be held in Honiara, Sblomon Islands in November 2023, as well as for dues and other expenses relating to the Pacific Games and hosting of the 2025 Pacific Mini Games. The

entire amount authorized to be appropriated and appropriated in this section shall come from local revenues. The amount authorized and appropriated in this Section shall not

lapse.

Section 29. Micro Games. The sum of \$280,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated for expenditure or obligation for Fiscal Year 2024 to fund Palau's participation in the upcoming 10th Micronesian Games which will be held in June 2024 in Majuro, Marshall Islands.

Section 30. <u>Festival of Pacific Arts</u>. The sum of \$250,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated and the amount of \$100,000 is hereby appropriated for expenditure or oilligation for Fiscal Year 2024 to fund Palau's participation in the 13th Festival of Pacific Arts and Collture to be field in Hawaii in June 2024. The entire amount authorized to be appropriated and appropriated in this section shall come from local revenues.

Section 31. <u>Economic Development Plan</u>. The amount of \$150,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated for expenditure or obligation for Fiscal Year 2024 to provide funding support for the implementation of Palau's Economic Development Plan.

Section 32. Mechesil Belau Conference.

- (a) The amount of \$50,000 is authorized for appropriation for expenditure or obligation for Fiscal Year 2024 for the organization and conduct of the Mechesil Belau Conference.
- (b) Section 9 of RPPL 11-30 is amended to read as follows:

"Section 9. Mecheail Belau Conference. The amount of \$100,000 is authorized for appropriation and is hereby appropriated for expenditure or obligation for the organization and conduct of the Mechesil Belau Conference. Such funds shall be administered by the Ministry of Resources, Cillture, Tourism, and Development which shail submit a detailed expenditure report of the funds to the President of the Republic of Palau, the Olbiil Era Kehllau, and the Office of the Public Auditor. Notwithstanding 27 PNC §192(b) and (f) or any other act, the entire amount authorized and appropriated in this section shall come from local revenues.

Section 34. Ngarchelong State Government. The sum of \$30,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated to the Ngarchelong State Government for the purpose of renovating the Ngerbau waiting house and for upgrading and renovating (allei Port. The entire amount authorized and appropriated in this section shall come from local revenues.

Section 35. Marine Transport Expenses. The sum of \$90,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated for expenditure or obligation for Fiscal Year 2023 for the purpose of marine transportation expenses. Notwithstanding any limitation in 40 PNC § 1404(b) or any other law, the entire amount of the funds authorized and appropriated in this section shall come from locul revenues. Section 36. Koror-Airai Sanitation Project (KASP) and related debt obligations.

Notwithstanding Section 19 of this Act concerning debt service or any other law, none

of the funds appropriated by this Act or any other law, except as exalicitly provided, may be used to pay the debt service on any loan used to fund the Koror-Airai Sanitation Project. PPUC, and the Republic of Palau, shall cease payment on any loan used to fund the Koror-Airai Sanitation Project until such time as an agreement is signed between the President of the Republic of Palau, such designated national government official or representative of the Palau Public Utilities Corporation that the President deems proper, and the Asian Development Bank. Such agreement shall be negotiated by the President or his designee with the Asian Devolopment Bank as soon as practicable, but within one year from the effective date of this Act and shall address the circumstances and disputes concerning repayment of loans related to the unfinished Koror-Airai Sanitation Project.

Section 37. Amendment. Section 2655 of Title 40 of the Polau National Code is amended as fallows:

"(a) Ten percent (10%) of the annual revenues derived from the tax imposed on alcohalic beverages under this subchapter shall be allocated to pay healthcare coverage subscription costs for citizens who are sixty (60) years of age or older and not working and for citizens who are disabled and not working in accordance with 41 PNC § 952(a). The Minister of Finance shall disburse to the Healthcare Fund the funds allocated under this subsection no later than the fifteenth day of the month failowing the end of each quarter of the fiscol year.

(b) Ten percent (10%) of the annual revenues derived from the tax imposed on alcoholic beverages under this subchapter shall be allocated to the Non-Communicable Diseases Fund established in section 1308 of this Title in an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dallars (\$500,000), and with any amount callected above five hundred thousand dallars (\$500,000) to be deposited into the National Treasury in a segregated fund authorized and appropriated to the Ministry of Health and Human Services for purposes aclated to hospital operations, programs, and activities, including medical supplies and drugs and other Ministry of Health and Human Services operations, and including the administrative control, staff, equipment and facilities of the Medical Referral

Program.

- (c) One percent (1%) of the annual revenues derived from the tax imposed on alcoholic beverages under this subchapter shall be allocated to the Palau Livestock Fund established by chapter 5 of Title 9 for a period of six (6) years beginning on the date of the establishment of the Palau Livestock Fund.
- (d) Ten percent (10%) of the annual revenues derived from the tax imposed on cigarettes and other tobacco products under this subchapter shall be allocated to pay healthcare coverage subscription costs for citizens who are sixty (60) years of age or blder and not working and for citizens who are disabled and not working in accordance with 41 PNC § 952(a), and for the Ministry of Heolth and Human Services in accordance with paragraphs (1) and (2).
 - (1) The Minister of Finance shool disburse the first six hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000) collected pursuant to subsection (d) to the Healthcare Fund for healthcare coverage subscription costs for citizens who are sixty (60) years of age or older and not working and for citizens who are disabled and not working in accordance with 41 PNC § 952(a) no later than the fifteenth day of the month fallowing the end of each quarter of the fiscol year.
 - (2) Any amounts in excess of six hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000) callected pursuant to subsection (d) shall be deposited into the National Treasury in a segregated fund authorized and appropriated to the Ministry of Health and Human Services for purposes related to hospital operations, programs, and activities, including medical supplies and drugs and other Ministry of Health and Human Services operations.
- (e) Ten percent (10%) of the annual revenues derived from the tax imposed on cigarettes and other tobacco products under this chapter shall be colocated to the Non-Communicable Diseases Fund established in section 1308 of this Title in an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dellars (\$500,000) and with any amount callected above five hundred thousand dellars (\$500,000) to be deposited into the National Treasury in a segregated fund authorized and appropriated to

the Ministry of Heulth and Human Services for purposes related to hospital operations, programs, and activities, including medical supplies and drugs and other Ministry of Health and Human Services operations, and including the administrative contral, staff, equipment and facilities of the Medical Referral Program.

Section 38. Power Purchase Agreement Escrow Account for PPUC. The sum of \$2,850,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated to establish a separate fund for the escrow account required by Section 21 of the April 14, 2021 Power Purchase Agreement between PPUC and Solar Pacific Pristine Power Inc. in accordance with the terms of that Agreement and such associated escrow agreement as may be subsequently entered into.

Section 39. Amendment. Section 412 of Tille 37 of the Palau National Code, is amended to read as follows:

"§ 412. Rates; rate making process; restriction of tariff raises by Palau Public Utilities Corporation.

...

- (k) PPUC's monthly kills to customers shall be transparent, clearly setting forth the name and amount of all Charges to customers, and shall not use opaque terminulogy such as "Other Charges" or "Adjustments". A Charge shall be "clearly set forth" where a customer will be able to compare the Charge on the bill to the entry on the Tariff Schedule filed pursuant to subsection (i) of this Section.
- (1) PPUC may not impose any monthly or periodic Charges on customers, except for valume based rates on the use of electricity, water, and wastewater, and for taxes owed for provision of the same. A Charge is montuly or periodic when it is buled at monthly or other regular periods to all customers, or any class of customers. Montuly or periodic charges include any charges incident to regular provision of service, and include any regalar "service fees", "buling fees", or

simular fixed fees that a customer is charged. Montbly or periodic charges do not include Charges for disconnection, reconnection; late payment, or other Charges imposed by reason of a specific customer's actions or inactions.

(m) Notwithstanding subsections (a) through (l) of this section or any other law, PPUC may not use any debt owed to the Asian Development Bank that was incurred to fund the Koror-Airai Sanitation Project (KASP) as a justification or basis for charging any rate or charge to any customer. No later than November 1, 2023, PPUC shall calcblate the amount that would have been used to make payments on the loans for KASP, and reduce its rates for wastewater so that the new total callected (incorporating any subsidies provided by law) is lower than the total that would have been callected, by the amount that would have been used to make said payments relating to the loans for KASP. PPUC shall publish its calcalation of this reduction to the Presiding Officers of each house of the Olbfil Era Kelblau. Obly for the purposes of placing this reduction into the tariff schedule, PPUC and PEWA shall waive all applicable administrative rbles for rate changes. The recalcblated wastewater rate shall be incorporated into PPUC's tariff schedble, which shall be filed with the President's office by November 1, 2023."

Section 40. National Development Bank of Palau Loan Restructuring for COVID-19 Impact on Small and Medium Enterprises.

- (a) The sum of \$500,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated for expenditure or obligation to the National Development Bank of Palau for Fiscal Year 2024 for the purposes of Section 195 of Title 26 of the Palau National Code, as added by this section.
- (b) <u>Amendment</u>. Title 26 of the Palau National Code is amended to include a new Section 195 as bollows:
 - "§ 195. Commercial Loan Restructuring for COVID Impacted Loans and Triggering Mechanism.
 - (a) Nor later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this section, the Bank shall submit a report to the Olbiil Era Kaıblau that details the Bank's portfblio to show the financial and economic impact the Bank and the Republic

of Palau will experience upon performing the responsibilities set forth in Subsections (c) of this Section.

- (b) The Bank's responsibilities set forth in Subsections (c) of this Section shall not be imtilemented nor effective, notwithstanding any other provision, until the Olbiil Era Keltilau appropriates funds for such purpose, or as otherwise set forth by law.
- (c) Because approximately seventy-two smoll and medium enterprises with loans from the Bank have been severely impacted by the unforeseeable COVID 19-Pandemic, and to provide these smail and medium enterprises an opportunity to recover and grow their businesses, the Bank shall write-off all interest and nonpayment on late payment penalties for commercial loans, entered into by smail and medium enterprises, severely impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic incurred during Calendar Years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023. The Bank shail also, with the consent of thee loan recipient, refinance all such loans using such payment terms, conditions, and long-term schedbles as are affordable for loan recipients and as wall support recovery of those loan recipients from the economic effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic.
- (d) Within this Section, the salowing terms shall have specific meaning as follows:
 - (1) "Write-off" shoil mean that that the Bank shall eliminate, from a customer's outstanding loan balance, all interest and penalties incurred during Calendar Years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023, including but not e limited to capitalized interest. Upon the effective date (pursuant to Subsection (b)) of Subsection(c) of this Section, to the extent interest and penalties have already been paid, the Bank shall deduct the amounts paid from the remaining balance of the loan. To the event any such loan has already been restructured, refinanced, or otherwise renegotiated or consolidated, the Bank shall, with the consent of the loan recipient, agree to unwind such restructuring or consalidation, and then write-off all balance attributable to interest or penalties.

- (2) "Smull and medium enterprises" shall mean businesses, including but not limited to sole proprietorships, small contractors, and self-employed persons, having net commercial assets of less than \$500,000 and average gross revenues in calendar years 2018 and 2019 of less than \$300,000.
- (3) "Nonpayment or late payment pennities" shall mean pennities or negative consequences incurred because a customer did not make full payment on the balance of a loan during Chlendar Years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023.
- (4) "Commercialt loans" shull mean loans issued by the Bank for commercial purposes, including but not limited to agriculture, fishing, and aquaculture related loans. "Commercial loans" shall include only those loans that had outstanding balances as of January 1, 2023.
- (5) "Severely impacted" shall mean that the borrower experienced a revenue decline of at least fifty (50) percent during the COVID-19 pandemic, as compared to the customer's business prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, or that the customer, in the Bank's determination, was totuly or substantially unable to achieve business success as a direct consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- (e) The Bank shall promnlgate regolations and forms as necessary to implement this Section. This Section shall be interpreted liberally to accomplish the purposes set forth in this Section.
- (f) The Bank shall not discriminate against, or otherwise negatively impact the credit rating of, any loan recipient by reason of that recipient having defaulted on a loan affected by this Section, or by reason of that recipient utilizing the provisions of this Section.
- (g) The Bank shall report to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Delegates, quarterly, on the implementation of this Section, the number of affected loans, and on the amounts written down."
- Section 41. Repair and Renovation of Bulldings in Guam Damaged by Typhoon

 Mawar. The sum of \$150,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated for the purposes

of repairing and renovating bolldings in Guam damaged by Typhoon Mawar. The total authorized in this section shall be ollocated according to the following schedale:

(1) Cultural	Center of the Republic of Palau	
(1) Cultural	Center of the Republic of Lalan	

(2) Asahi Club of Guam \$75,000

(3) Peleliu Club of Guam \$60,000

Section 42. Aimeliik Road Maintenance. The sum of \$25,000 is hereby authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated to the Aimeliik State Government for the purpose of road maintenance expenses. The entire amount authorized and appropriated in this section shall come from local revenues. Any unexpended or unobligated balance of the appropriation of this section shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

Section 43. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Act is found to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the offending part of portions may be severed from the rest of the boll, and the remaining parts or portions shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 44. Effective date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the President of the Republic of Palau or upon its becoming law without such approval.
